### NEC CORNER:

#### **Article 300.4 (E): Cables & Raceways Installed Under Roof Decking**

“A cable or raceway type wiring method installed in exposed or concealed locations under metal-corrugated sheet roof decking shall be installed and supported so the nearest outside surface of the cable or raceway is not less than 38 mm (1 ½”) from the nearest surface of the roof decking.”

**EXCEPTION:** “Rigid metal conduit and intermediate metal conduit shall not be required to comply. “

The reasoning behind this is that during the roofing process, or re-roofing later, long screws are sometimes used to hold down the insulation and/or roofing membrane resulting in damage to the raceway and conductors. There are several spring steel clips by Caddy or B-Line designed for this purpose; be aware of how the roof structure decking is supported because most of the time bar joists are used, which have a 2” blouse on the topside making them perfect to support the raceway.

### COLE'S CORNER

The Pre-Fab shop is doing well and continually showing benefits on all jobs taking advantage of the opportunity. We currently have a labor force of 9 men, but have reached a labor peak of 16 men in the second half of this year. For the apprentices, the Pre-Fab shop is proving to be a good training ground with all of the supervised hands-on training they are receiving.

A few examples of the items produced in the pre-fab shop are: complete in-wall rough in components utilizing both hard conduit and flexible cable, overhead flexible cable supports, conduit racks, light fixtures, light pole assemblies, panel board assemblies, painted telecom backboards, painted conduit fittings and boxes, under floor computer whips (UL listed) and complete conduit systems ready for in-slab installation.

Some jobs that have taken advantage of the pre-fab opportunity include: Rockdale Medical Center, Northside Oncology, MLK, Gwinnett Medical, Floyd Medical Center, Cobb County, Lockheed, HP Alpharetta, Qualtex, Phoebe Sumter, Paulding Sleep Lab, Paulding Pulmonary, MHJIT, Harbin Clinic, Kennestone Outpatient Pavilion, Piedmont, Airport, AT&T, C-Tech, Egleston, and CHOA.

The Pre-Fab shop is always continuing to find innovative ways pre-fab can be utilized. A prime example of an innovative idea was the pre-fab of the airport light poles. With a total of 17 poles, each at 10' tall and weighing around 1600 pounds apiece after the lights were installed, the pre-fab shop successfully assembled the poles with the fixtures and wiring and got them shipped safely to the airport.

We are always looking for more jobs to help and more ideas to tackle, so make sure to keep pre-fab in mind when planning for your job.
